



#### **How to Be an Explorer!**

Laurie, once an Explorer, quickly became part of our community. But finding your place in a group isn't always easy. We asked her how she did it. Here's some of what she told us: (but, no, you don't have to do it all at once...)

Attend Circle meetings (on Zoom) as many as you can:
 Development, Marketing & Membership, Community Life,
 Administration... and more. You learn what we're doing, how we're doing it, and you'll get to know who we are. You don't have to talk!

- Attend informal Zoom gatherings: the Friday afternoon Happy Hour; the Sunday afternoon "Fiber Arts" (free-form chat); the Tuesday morning coffee hour, the book group, and others. Ask your Buddy!
- Attend training sessions on Sociocracy, our method of governance.
- Learn everything you can about cohousing: the books, the videos and older newsletters. Links are on the website.
- Volunteer! If one of the Circles fits your skill set, ask to help.
- **Utilize your "Buddy"**, the member assigned to help you learn about us. Get all your questions answered.
- Wade into our Google Drive, where you'll find the meeting minutes, member profiles, policies and so much more.
- Attend the monthly "Full Circle" Zoom meeting when all members are present.

Laurie went to this effort because, she told us, "I want to live with people I resonate with." And to find her place in the community. We believe that she has!
